Information about recycling in more than 5,000 municipalities in the U.S., Canada and Australia is already available on Recycle Coach. Some municipalities are fully built out with collection schedules, notification systems and a 'what goes where' search tool. Others require a small number of people to sign up for information before the full range of services will be available. As soon as enough people sign up, everyone is notified that their community information has been completed and they can get personalized information about their recycling program.
